Advent Introduction

Welcome to this Advent edition of the Con-Tributary, it is a pleasure to be able to introduce this final edition for 2023 as we are all beginning to think about preparing for the Christmas season. Unless you happen to be highly organised and efficient and have already started! (Just to share, I am definitely not one of those people.)

We are quite used to thinking about Advent as a time of preparation, I am sure. But sometimes we might lose track of exactly what we might be preparing for and how we are supposed to go about it. It is one thing to prepare for a new job, a new child, or a Christmas dinner, but Advent is supposed to be preparing for the return of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. How are we supposed to do that?

Well, one thought that has been growing in me over the course of the year has been the almost throw away line in the Creed of how Christ will come to judge the living and the dead. When we think of judgement we tend to think about crime and punishment and perhaps pompous legal officers in funny wigs.

Most of us can sit comfortably with this idea. It means we can try and "be good" and follow the rules we've made for ourselves and everything will be OK. Not to mention the fact that all those we lapse into thinking about as "them" will suffer the consequences. I worry that some people get far too much comfort from that idea.

But what happens if we think of that line as "Christ will come to bring justice to the living and the dead". What does a world of God's justice look like? How do we prepare for that? How do we train our hearts to long for it?

As I leave you to your preparations for Advent and Christmas I leave you with these words from the Song of Mary in Luke 1.52-53.

"He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty."

May you have a happy and blessed Christmas. Daniel
