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# Thought for the Week from Mothers Union Australia Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> March 2024 Women in Holy Week

'The women who had come with Jesus from Galilee followed Joseph and saw the tomb and how his boy was laid in it' *Luke* 23:55.

As we think about the death and resurrection of Jesus, it is important that there were witnesses to the treatment of his body and those prepared to look after the body with spices and perfumes. Important because it means that the body of Jesus was not lost. Its whereabouts was known. And it was the women who were able to bear witness to this. Their witness throughout is a key part of the evidence. And it fits completely with the respect that Jesus showed for women and the importance of his encounters with them. He was bearing witness to the great truth of the gospel that the message of Christ is equally for men and women and that we are all one in him.

#### **Question for thought:**

What do you owe to the godly women in your life?

Almighty God, Father of all mercies we thank you for the relative stability in Zambia and pray for members in Central Zambia at this Easter time that they will know the hope of the resurrection. May they share your Word with members across the Diocese as they help prepare couples for marriage and campaign against gender-based violence. Amen.

Coming to know Jesus is a matter of hearing the word about him, the gospel, and turning to him in repentance and faith. We put our trust in him. ## Thought for the Week from Mothers Union Australia Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> March 2024 Mothering

'I am reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also' 2 Timothy 1:5.

The power of a mother's (and grandmother's) faith and prayers must never be underestimated. The great scholar of the early Church, Augustine, had strayed a long way from the Christian faith of his mother, Monica. She agonised in prayer over him, even pleading with the famous Bishop of Milan, St Ambrose for help. He said to her these famous words, 'It cannot be that the child of such tears should perish.' St Augustine came to know the Lord, and is today remembered as one of the greatest thinkers and writers of all Christin history. He likened his mother to the widow of Nain in the gospel story, whose son was dead until Christ raised him to life. Such is the way that the Lord uses the prayers of the faithful, and not least mothers and grandmothers.

## **Question for Thought:**

Do I pray earnestly for my children and for the families around me?

Lord of all, we pray for relief from suffering and war in Awerial in South Sudan. Help members as they seek to improve the spiritual growth of women refugees. We thank you for their commitment to evangelism in the refugee camps as well as sharing practical skills for poverty eradication. Amen.

'Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven' *Matthew 5:16* 

As Christians, we are committed to serve our church family, but also the wider community. It is no accident that the care for the poor and weak is so often done by our Christian organisations. But as individuals we are called to share the good news about Jesus and to look after the needs of those around us, especially the sick, homeless and the elderly and the disadvantaged. But notice what Jesus says in *Matthew 5:16*. Whatever we do individually and as members of Mothers Union it is to be done in such a way that people will give glory to God and not to us. We always need to point to Jesus.

**Fair Trade Matters** 

'The Lord detests dishonest scales, but accurate weights find favour with him' *Proverbs 11:1.* 

The Lord calls us to justice in all our dealings with our fellow humans, whether in the home or in the workplace or in the marketplace. Unfortunately, you may have noticed farmers and other workers are not always paid what they deserve for their labours. As we are able, we need to redress this balance and ensure that justice is done. Certainly, one of the key things we can do is pray for the disadvantaged. But it is also good to support those who are working to serve the interests of the poor by selling their goods at a fair price. We need to remember the words of the prophet Micah, 'What does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God' *Micah* 6:8

#### **Question for thought:**

In what way am I walking with justice and mercy?

Merciful Lord, we pray for the political situation in Myanmar that there will be an end to injustice. We bring before you the Diocese of Mandalay and pray for members that they will continue to have courage and perseverance in spite of opposition to the Christianity. As they care for their communities may they show forth your love. Amen
